HGE developed concept plans and working drawings for pedestrian improvements related to street renovation in downtown Gresham, Oregon. An award-winning prototype plan was developed in cooperation with the city and downtown merchants, which emphasized a pedestrian-friendly environment.

HGE provided design, survey, grant application and construction management services for the grading, paving, lighting, signals, utility relocation, drainage, parking requirements, street plans, profiles, surface improvements, and landscaping elements of the entire length of North Main Street, though the downtown business core. This was a federally aided project totaling \$1,200,000. The completed design was awarded “Gresham’s Best 1990 Community Design Award.”

Pedestrian improvements include bomanite crosswalks, new sidewalks of patterned concrete, street trees, benches, litter receptacles, ornamental street lighting, and narrowed lane width at strategic locations.
